To'rayev, researching the dangerous aspects of this, states: "Nowadays, the ideological field that has emerged to disrupt the life of societies has a complex nature; the strategies of existing ideologies are changing, and the advancement of modern ideological propaganda methods and technical-technological means not only affects the consciousness of individuals but also influences the lifestyles of entire peoples and nations, creating conditions to externally control the life of any society and the politics of states" [4]. 


Figure 1. Innovative tools of ideological renewal and ideological prevention in Uzbekistan

Third stage: general secondary education (from 7 (6) to 10 years old in primary grades, and 11 to 17 (18) years old);


Fourth stage: young people engaged in production activities and those unemployed, as well as youth in vocational schools and higher education institutions [6].


